## Taqwa

"And to Allah belongs all that is in the heavens and on earth. And verily, We have directed the people of the Book before you, and you to have taqwa of Allah (be conscious of the presence of Allah and keep your duty to Him)."

Taqwa of Allah is an important characteristic which influences the daily activities, behavior, manners and characters of the true believer. A number of translations of the word Taqwa have been proposed, such as fear, piety, heeding and learning self restraint. In this article an attempt is made to provide a number of definitions for taqwa, to identify its components and to describe the significance and benefits of taqwa, on the basis of the Qur'an and the authentic sayings of the Prophet (PBUH).

## Meaning of the word Taqwa

The word Taqwa and its derivatives have been repeated 258 times in the Qur'an. It is derived from the Arabic verb ittaq'a إتقا which means taking or using wiqa'ya $\quad$, (protection). In the human self there should be a device to protect from doing harm to one's own self and other fellow human beings, and to control the violation of the pure self created by Allah. Such protection would be produced when one is on the highest level of consciousness of the presence of Allah. And no one can reach such a level unless, and only after, he/she believes in Allah, has faith in Him and is aware of His power and His wisdom.

The attributes of Allah can be divided into two categories:
a) Attributes of Beauty and Grace صفات Jor such as The Great Forgiver , The Compassionate الر حمنار , The Merciful الر حمیم; and b) Majestic Attributes صفات جلال such as The Dominant القهار ,The compeller , The Humiliator المذل , The

Avenger المنتقم, and The Distresser الضار. Fear of the majestic attributes of Allah is one parameter which would contribute to the development of taqwa, by protecting oneself from Allah's displeasure and punishment, but fear itself is not taqwa. Piety and

righteousness are the functional products of taqwa. Taqwa may therefore be considered as the highest level of consciousness, or of being conscious of the presence of Allah. Other definitions for taqwa, proposed by Muslim scholars, are shown in the figure on page 3.

The Qur'an also refers to taqwa in the sense of fear of (and protecting one's own self from) a) the hellfire which Allah uses for punishing those who deliberately disobey Him, and b) the day we shall be brought back to Allah, when the guilty ones will not be helped by anyone.

## Characteristics of Muttaqeen

Muttaqeen are those who have taqwa, ie. are conscious of the presence of Allah. Their characteristics are given in the following verses of the Qur'an (see the figure on page 3 )

"It is not righteousness that you turn your faces towards East or West; But it is righteousness - to believe in Allah and the Last Day, and the Angels, and the Book, and the Messengers; To spend of your substance, out of love for Him, for your kin, for orphans, for the needy, for the wayfarer, for those who

ask, and for the ransom of slaves; to be steadfast in prayer, and give Zakah, to fulfill the contracts which you have made; and to be firm and patient, in pain (or suffering) and adversity, and throughout all periods of panic. Such are the people of truth, the ones who have taqwa."
(Qur'an 2:177)

"Be quick in the race for forgiveness from your Lord and for a Garden whose width is that (of the whole) of the Heavens and of the earth, prepared
for those who have taqwa, - Those who spend (freely) whether in prosperity, or in adversity; who restrain anger, and pardon (all) people; - for Allah loves those who do good:- And those who, having done an act of indecency or wronged their own souls Remember Allah and ask forgiveness for their sins, - And who can forgive sins except Allah?- And are never obstinate in persisting knowingly in (the wrong) they have done." (Qur'an 3:133-135)

## Rewards for Muttaqeen

Several verses in the Qur'an list the rewards, bliss, heavenly pleasures and Gardens promised to Muttaqeen (those who have taqwa), including (see the figure on page 7):

1. The assurance that Allah is with them and loves them.

"Truly, Allah is with those who have taqwa, and those who do good."

2. Receiving the help, protection and guidance of Allah.

3. Receiving blessings from heaven and earth.

4. Preparing a way for them out of every difficulty, providing them from (sources) they never could imagine, and making matters easy for them.

6. Gardens of eternity, pure spouses and Allah's pleasure.

"For those who have taqwa there are gardens with their Lord, underneath which rivers flow. Therein (is their) eternal (home); with spouses purified and the good pleasure of Allah."

How much aqua do we owe Allah?

The answer to this question is given in three verses:

"O ye who believe, have taqwa of Allah, as should be due to Him, and die not except in a state of complete submission (to Allah)."
(Qur'an 3:102)

"So have taqwa of Allah as much as you can; listen and obey."
(Qur'an 64:16)
The first verse sets an ideal which every believer should try to attain. The second verse lays down the principle that no one has been required to exert himself/herself beyond his/her power and ability. The third verse enjoins every believer to try to attain piety and consciousness of Allah as far as he/she can.


Allah uses taqwa as the only basis of superiority and excellence of one person over others.

"Verily, the most honored of you in the sight of Allah is the one who has the most taqwa." (Qur'an 49:13)

The Prophet (PBUH) said:

Have taqwa of Allah (Be conscious of the presence of Allah) wherever you are, and follow the sinful deed with a good deed, it will wipe its effect, and treat people well.

## Fasting and Taqwa

The relationship between fasting and taqwa is described in the following verse.
يَآأُنُهَا الَّذِينَ ءَامَنُوا كُتِبَ عَلَيْكُمُ

(سورة البقرة - آية (Mr)
"O ye who believe! fasting is prescribed for you as it was prescribed for those before you that you may become muttaqeen." (Qur'an 2:183)

If one goes through the fasting of Ramadan and carefully observes the objectives of fasting and strives hard to perfect his/her fasting (by controlling all aspects of his/her behavior), he/she is likely to come out of it a revolved and changed one. So fasting can be viewed as a practical means of transformation of believers مؤمنين to the higher spiritual level of muttaqeen.

We pray to almighty Allah to give us the strength and the support to practice the full meaning of taqwa in every aspect of our life.
